








VO script:	<p>Hi, I'm Priya. I work on reception, which means fire evacuation is something I think about more than most. In our last drill, it took us twice as long as it should have — fourteen minutes, when our target is seven. I'm going to walk you through what happened, what the correct procedure looks like, and what we all need to do differently. By the end, you'll know how to exit the building safely, understand correct behaviour in an evacuation and have explored the consequences of inappropriate actions. It won't take long, and it matters.</p>

Slide Visual:			Additional notes:	<p>Scenario branching behaviour</p> <p><i>Both branching scenarios (Marco's Decision and Diane's Decision) use a forced-choice model. Incorrect answers do not advance the learner — instead, Priya delivers the consequence feedback for that choice, and the question is then re-presented so the learner must select again. Only the correct answer advances the learner to the next section. All consequence feedback should still play in full before the question re-presents — do not skip or truncate it.</i></p> <p><i>This differs from the Knowledge Check, where all answers advance the learner and the</i></p>

				<i>pass/fail logic is handled by the SCORM completion trigger.</i>

VO script:	Marco hesitates, then leaves the bag. You both reach the stairwell within 20 seconds. That wasn't easy — telling a senior colleague to leave his things takes confidence. But that's exactly what this building needs from you. Marco's laptop was recovered undamaged. His proposal went out the same afternoon. Forty seconds of protocol would have cost him nothing — and could have cost the people behind him everything.

Saying nothing felt respectful — but fire safety is one of the few situations where silence is not neutral. Every person in this building has the right and the responsibility to challenge unsafe behaviour, regardless of who is doing it.</p>



If you see someone grabbing their bag, say something. In our last drill, that result belonged to all of us. The next drill, and any real emergency, will too. You don't need to be a fire marshal to speak up. You just need to be a colleague.</p>
